

Statements from Pennsylvania Home Buyers

- Six person family: "Desperately needs the government [to grant a waiver] or my family may not have a place to live on April 20, 2020." --Ryan
- Rental or Hotel?: "[W]e have given notice to move out of our current rental home. . . . Now we are in a state of flux [and] either have to move multiple times possibly to a different rental property (if available) or potentially to a hotel." --Trevor
- Splitting our family up to make room: "[A]fter April 1st we have to move out of our temporary residence with 2 boys, one who is 19 months old and our other is 10 weeks. We are unable to find any residence with family or friends due to our family size and [it] looks as though we will be left with our only option of splitting our family up until this issue gets resolved." --Tim
- Essential business workers need homes: "My husband and I both work for an essential business and are able to work from our home. Unfortunately, we may not have a home to work out of for much longer. . . . I feel like this whole situation would be less scary for us all if we actually knew where we were going to be living a month from now. Please pause and truly imagine this for your family. I know that new home builders are essential . . . provide a home for families when we all NEED a safe place to be inside. . . . Lennar [provides safe] virtual walkthroughs, drive through signing of settlement paperwork, and limits what teams are working within a home at the same time [so] please review and approve Lennar's waiver to be a life-sustaining, essential business in Pennsylvania." --Chantelle
- Thirteen-year-old fears of being homeless: "I am thirteen years old. I feel very strongly about the fact that construction is a life sustaining business. This is true because in order to live you need to have shelter. Without it, you won't survive for very long. The house we are in right now is small and we are cramped in it. This is because school is online now and my parents' company has told them to work from home. . . . I am worried that we won't have a home in a month, if it takes that long, because I heard my parents talking about how our landlords have a new family moving in by May 10th." --Sierra
